



Fly-posting is the illegal display of advertisements and notices on the public highway or without the Planning Authority. This includes display on the street furniture, staked in roundabouts, and on trees.

Since the Cleaner Neighbourhoods and Environment Act 2005 became law, new measures have been introduced enabling local authorities to fine anyone committing an environmental crime that damages the environment. Authorities in Norfolk have agreed set levels of fines to cover the entire county.

Graffiti and fly-posting, section 44 Anti-social Behaviour Act 2003, full amount of penalty, £80.00, maximum penalty on conviction, £2500.00.

Norfolk Highways Agency has advised that anyone can remove signs that are placed on highway verges.
