STATEMENT OF COMMUNITY INVOLVEMENT (2017)

CONSULTATION ON MINOR AMENDMENT

The Statement of Community Involvement (SCI) outlines how South Norfolk Council will consult with the public and other stakeholders on major planning issues. This includes consultations on the documents that make up the Local Plan and on dealing with planning applications. The Council must comply with the SCI in preparing any Local Plan document or when determining a planning application.

Following the issuing of Government guidance on local authority plan-making and related consultations during the Covid-19 pandemic, South Norfolk Council has reviewed its SCI and is proposing a minor amendment. This relates to the availability of hard copy consultation documents from the Council offices. South Norfolk Council remains committed to ensuring those without internet access can engage with plan making consultations and will put in place measures to ensure this is possible.

The Council is currently consulting on this proposed amendment and the deadline for anyone wishing to submit a response is **5.00pm on Friday 4th September**.
