I have temporarily been promoted to sergeant with the extra responsibility of managing a small team of officers within South Norfolk.

This hasn't detracted my role within Hetherset and Mulbarton SNT.

I have dealt with a criminal offence investigation at the Norfolk and Norwich University Hospital, actively dealing with Anti-Social Behaviour in Mulbarton, Speed enforcement in and around Bawburgh, successful removals of 2 abandoned vehicles in Hetherset and Keswick.

I have been made aware of drug activity in Cringleford where I have been pro-actively patrolling the area and I continue to support and problem solve households in all areas where a multi-agency approach is needed. I also retain a Possession with Intent of supplying drugs investigation where extensive enquires are required.

I intend to conduct speed enforcement and be a visible presence during school drop off/pick up with regards to school safety, I aim to get the schools more involved with pupils (Health and Safety adhered to) helping me to put the right message out with driving/parking considerably which is safe. I will pilot this at the Cringleford Primary School at the end of march.
